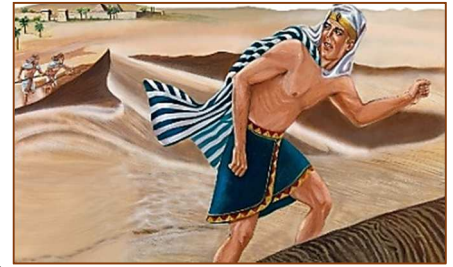

Before the last plague, Moses said to the elders of Israel, "Each man is to sacrifice a lamb. Put the blood on the top and both sides of the doorposts of your home. This will protect your family. When God goes through the land to strike down the first born of every Egyptian family, He will see the blood and pass over the doorway."
