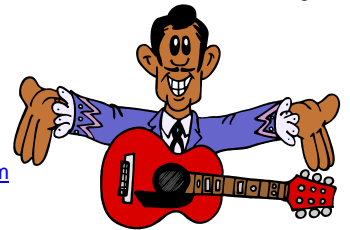

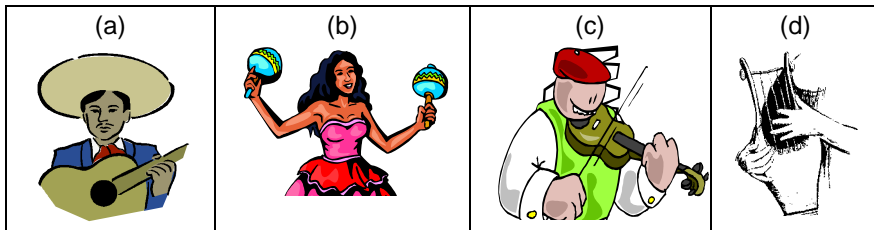

### Mexican Music and Dancing

The Mariachi is the name of the traditional street music played in Mexico. In this type of music, there are usually two violins, a harp, guitarrón (bass guitar), a guitarra de golpe (five stringed instrument) and maracas.

### Food

This is one of the best parts of the fiesta. During the festival in Mexico on the 16th September, it takes the people many days to get ready. Mexican food is a mix of Indian and Spanish food. Here is a filling for a tortilla, which is a pancake made from corn or maize.

**Ingredients:** Cooked, spicy meat strips, sour cream and salsa.  
**Salsa:** 4 large tomatoes, chopped; 1 chopped onion;  
 ¼ teaspoon red chilli powder and ½ a chopped green chilli;  
 3 tablespoons finely minced parsley; 2 tablespoons vinegar;  
 ½ tablespoon salt; some pepper  
 Blend all salsa ingredients together. Spoon meat into tortilla, add sour cream and salsa to taste. Wrap up into a 'parcel'. Enjoy!
