Computer Literacy – Year 4

A computer is like a 'thinking machine'. A computer doesn't have a brain like humans. It has a machine 'brain' called a CPU. This stands for Central Processing Unit. You put data into a computer. Data are the facts that you give the computer. This is called input. The CPU takes this data and processes it. The work that results from processing is called output. If you want to make a cake, the *input* is the ingredients for the cake, the *processing* is cooking and the *output* is the cake.
